 - Auction results were taken by ACBS, and we await a list of auction winners and amounts to be credited to our account for items sold.

 - George asked for a zoom meeting with Sue, Holly and Steve to coordinate reports he needs from Lora:

 - Elections:

 - Rich Butler said his wife, Amy, offered to take over that position.
 - Bevon expressed interest in joining the BOD.
 - Que will send out a message to the membership advising them of the tasks to be performed and solicit interest in joining the BOD.
 - Greg also mentioned his interest in being made aware of BOD needs to better understand how he can offer meaningful help.
 - Long range plan was partially suspended at the point of identifying and prioritizing objectives in 2008. ☐ Don Swain has it on his hard drive and will send it to all. A full update is needed.
 - John will approach M.J. Reale to see if she is interested in advertising after putting together the welcome booklet.
 - Hacker, Shelburne Country Store, Dakin Farm, Adirondack Guideboats and those already advertising in our newsletter will be asked to renew their support.
 - 2023 Boat Show will happen, possibly at the end of July. The Boathouse works as long as we have enough slips available and where they are readily accessible to the public.
 - Why Burlington?
 - Boathouse yields the highest number of spectators.
 - Plattsburgh has new docks and a waterfront hotel is being planned.
 - Basin Harbor might work well, but may not yield a large number of public spectators. Steve mentioned they hosted shows in the '70's & 80's. Susie suggested having antique aircraft at that venue.
 - Chapter dues:
 - National is \$65, we are \$25.
 - Chapter income is 50% dues and 50% advertising. We are one of the more expensive chapters in ACBS, and Sue has heard a few complaints.
 - Holly mentioned the real costs are for our events (shows and dinners).
 - Greg suggested combining a low chapter dues amount with a donation.
 - All agreed to keep the dues at \$25.
 - The problem is the national dues.
